
BEFORE-AND-AFTER PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

Good photos can help your patients understand treatment recommendations and track results

Take patient photos as an initial step prior to consultation





If using a phone or tablet camera:

(Device should be dedicated to your office; do not use personal devices.)




Turn off flash



Hold up to align with patient's eyes



Use pinch-to-zoom feature to focus closely on face





The size and frame of before-and-after photos should be consistent for easy comparability.

Show the patient their photos on a tablet or mobile phone to support treatment recommendations.



BEFORE-AND-AFTER PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

Effective before-and-after photos are an important tool for consultations, and they're especially useful for showing change over time.

Consider your before-and-after photo process carefully.

USE THIS BASIC PROCESS TO TAKE PHOTOS FROM MULTIPLE ANGLES


STEP 1
Front view
(Mirror view)



STEP 2
Oblique and profile views (Society's views)



STEP 3
Chin down, eyes up view



If the patient doesn't see the problem, they won't consider treating the problem.


Often, patients see things in photos from angles they didn't notice in the mirror.



BEFORE-AND-AFTER PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

USE THIS ADVANCED PROCESS TO TAKE PHOTOS SHOWING ANIMATION

STEP1



STEP 2Kiss/pucker



STEP 3Raise eyebrows



STEP 4
Lower eyebrows





Ensure you take photos of patients posttreatment to capture their *after* images. *Before* photos, when paired with *after* photos, help patients fully see their treatment results.

BEFORE-AND-AFTER PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

CONSIDER THESE POINTERS WHEN TAKING PHOTOS

DO



- ✓ Consistent lighting and position
- ✓ Same background
- ✓ Hair away from face
- ✓ Take multiple views
 - Front view (mirror view)
 - Oblique and profile views (society's views)
 - Chin down, eyes up view
- ✓ Facial animation
 - Smile
 - Kiss/pucker
 - Raise/lower eyebrows



- **DON'T**
- X Inconsistent lighting and position
- X Different background
- X Hair obstructing face

- X No facial expressions
 - X Distracting jewelry
 - X Take photos on personal devices



Examples of GOOD photos

MAINTAINING YOUR PHOTOS



Develop a naming convention for your photo files for easy identification and retrieval.



Assign a specific team member to store and archive photo files and to include them in patients' files, ensuring HIPAA compliance.

Remember to share the photos with your patients during the assessment, and ask treated patients for consent to share their photos with other patients as well as for use online.
